- To be aware of some seasonal changes e.g. leaves falling from trees.

Hear

Mathematics

More Than, Fewer, the Same

- Collect objects to compare amounts
- Make comparisons of amounts
- Look for collections of large and small amounts
- Compare and talk about large and small amounts
- Make large and small amounts
- Make collections the same

Explore and Build With Shapes and Objects

- Explore and play with shapes
- Show interest in the simple differences between shapes
- Put shapes and blocks into position
- Select shapes for a reason
- Begin to explore and describe natural shapes and objects
- Find and collect objects for a purpose

Explore Repeats

- Listen to repeats in songs and stories (The Little Red Hen, Dig Dig Digging)
- Join in with songs with repeats (Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star, Polly Put the Kettle On, The Grand Old Duke of York)
- Start to join in repeats with stories
- Clap along to songs
- Make line patterns with own sequences

Hear and Say Number Names

- Hear some number names and join in with them
- Model and practise saying number names in order
- Join in stable order counting forwards and backwards

Understanding the World

Past and Present

- Adjusting to new daily routine.
- To recognise key points in day e.g. lunch time, home time and begin to anticipate

People, Culture and Communities

- To become aware that we are different.
- To know that we are part of a family at home and in school.
- Invite parish priest in to meet the children to recognise the key people in their parish.

Understanding the World

The Natural World

- To recognise if objects are hard and soft.
- To recognise and name main body parts and facial features.
- To talk about features of new environment.
- Talk about their classroom, the outdoor areas, to see and appreciate God's world around them.
- Describe the beauty, awe, and wonder they have seen and talked about.

Expressive Arts and Design

Being Imaginative and Expressive

To learn the song and rhymes:

- I love my teddy bear
- Round & round the garden
- Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear Turn Around
- Use songs and hymns to move and dance in time to the music

Creating with Materials

- Drawing / painting faces
- Handprints
- Enjoying making marks
- Safely use a variety of materials, tools, and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form to create art of God's Common Home

Prime Areas of Learning

Communication and Language

- Listen to and understand a simple story with pictures, although they can still get easily distracted at times
- Understand longer instructions, such as 'make teddy jump' or 'put daddy's cup on the table'.
- Understand simple 'what' questions.
- Understand the words 'big and 'little'.
- Put 4 or 5 words together to make short sentences, such as 'me want more juice' or 'he took my ball'.
- Asking questions.
- Use action words such as 'run' and 'fall' as well as words for the names of things.

Physical Development

- Beginning to sit at carpet time.
- Walking up and down steps (2 feet to a step, holding rail).
- Jump with both feet together
- Kick a ball
- Moving around environment, safely negotiating space.
- Beginning to try to manage personal hygiene – toileting, handwashing with support.
- Show interest in early mark making activities.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Transition – separating from parent/carer
- To recognise emotions of happy and sad.
- Developing relationships with staff.
- Engage with others through gestures, gaze and talk.
- Adjusting to new routine and rules.
- Beginning to learn to share and take turns with support.
